



Care

Looking after everyone in our community is at the very heart of what we do. We believe that working in partnership with our parents, carers and families is the best way to get the best out of, and for, our students. Frequent communication between home and school happens online through School Synergy. We have achieved the Leading Parent Partnership Award and our IWO works closely with local families and support groups. We expect our parents to attend Parents' Evenings and events. Research tells us that children do best when they are supported at home and there is a positive relationship between home and school.

Community

We are a community comprehensive school and we believe that our students should develop a keen appreciation of their heritage, and pride in their town and country. We have strong links with our local primary schools, local businesses and the Rotary Club. Our students participate in community events such as: Bolton 2030, youth MPs and Mayor for the day; Bolton Lads and Girls Club visit the school frequently to encourage participation in National Citizenship activities. Our charity work supports local and national charities; twice a year, senior citizens are welcomed to a tea party followed by matinee performances of our musicals. Our students have led a brilliant campaign to ensure students are trained in First Aid including emergency resuscitation (The Heart Beats 2020 campaign) and our 'Adopt a Grandparent' scheme has had real impact in the community.

Community means recognising the value everyone contributes to society, giving a helping hand where it is needed and being positive role models through participation. You'll find plenty of community spirit at Westhoughton High!

Safeguarding

Westhoughton High School is committed to Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all of its students. Facilities

We have a wide range of facilities at Westhoughton High School to support learning and promote enjoyment of school life these include:

- Modern teaching spaces with large format touch display screens
- 8 IT suites with over 250 PCs
- 4 specialist technology rooms designed for the teaching of Food Technology, Resistant materials and textiles
- 10 Science laboratories
- Full size 4G pitch
- 2 swimming pools
- Fitness suite
- Squash, Basketball & Netball courts
- Dance studio
- 2 dining rooms with conservatories
- 2 outside food outlets (food pod and food truck)
- Specialist Drama and Music studios.
- School garden
- Modern open plan Library space with 32 laptops
- Photography suite with dark room

Our site is equipped to support students with mobility issues in accessing specialist teaching spaces and to support additional needs during the school day.

Extra-Curricular

It is also important that students develop a sense of wider community and they have opportunities to work with or compete against other schools in events such as Youth Speaks, World Class Maths tests, the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme, Children's University and joint visits to Oxford and Cambridge universities. Students also develop independence and a sense of their heritage through day and residential trips at home and abroad; just a few examples are a weekend in the Lakes for outdoor pursuits, theatre trip to London, skiing in Austria and France, History/Geography trip to Belgium, France, Italy or Prague and a visit to the Christmas markets.


Each Other

Our aim is to build a passion for learning that lasts throughout adult life. Our staff are well supported in their own learning, working hard to be the best that they can be – as teachers, as leaders and as learners. Learning is infectious, our students learn from the passion and skill of their teachers. Students will develop a passion for reading and build resilience to be increasingly independent in their learning as they prepare for the next steps in education.

Destinations

We are committed to providing a variety of career-based learning from Year 7 onwards which includes subject links with employers, visits to workplaces, conventions and local colleges and developing the skills required in the workplace, alongside the qualifications needed for progression. We believe our students gain the knowledge and skills that will allow them access to any institution to further their learning. From our destination data we can see 97% of our students last year went onto further education, work based training or full time employment.

Literacy

At Westhoughton High School, we understand that strong literacy skills have a direct correlation with students' confidence, resilience, self-awareness and articulation of self-expression that leads to social and emotional competence, as well as academic success. Our school is committed to giving our young people the best academic chances and access to the best opportunities in life by developing excellent communication skills in reading, writing and oracy.

We believe every teacher is a teacher of literacy and ensure that quality literacy support is provided across all subject areas through consistency of effective, evidence-based whole school strategies and approaches. In addition to literacy support during lessons, students are constantly exposed to fiction and non-fiction reading material during our 'Register and Read' form time activity and in our library. The library is currently undergoing exciting developments to ensure it offers an even fuller and of-the-minute range of quality library resources to support all students, staff and families in the community.
