What are the main College options for you when leaving school?

VOCATIONAL COURSES

Our Vocational courses are taught by industry-experienced teachers. They give you the opportunity to use theories you learn in practical situations, improve your independent study skills and develop your communication and teamwork skills whilst studying one subject area.

A-LEVEL COURSES

An A-Level programme consists of three subjects of your choice. This gives you a chance to study multiple subjects you are interested in or passionate about. The programmes run for two years and will give you the chance to develop your research, analysis and evaluation skills with a focus on independent study.

VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL COURSES

These advanced level courses allow students the academic rigour of A-Levels coupled with the practical elements of vocational studies.

You can select a combination of three courses that suit your needs and aspirations.

T-LEVEL COURSES

A mixture of classroom learning and at least 45 days of on-the-job placements, in the industry you are studying. 80% of your time will be spent at college and 20% will be on placement. They have been designed with employers to make sure the qualifications meet the needs of the industry and prepare you for the world of work.

Qualifications/Entry Requirements

A-Levels

- Five 5s including Maths & English Language.
- we will consider 1 Vocational Qualification in a related subject
- Certain subjects require 6 or above
- Choose three (or occasionally four)
 A-Levels
- Two year study programme
- Assessment mainly through exams

Single Vocational A-Levels

- Five 4s including English Language or Maths
- We will consider 1
 Vocational Qualification in place of a GCSE and will also require a grade 4 in Maths or English Language
- These courses can be taken alongside other single vocational A-Levels and A-Level courses.
- Take a combination of three single vocational A-Levels or A-Level mixed programme
- Two year study programme
- Assessment mostly coursework with some exam modules

Vocational Courses

- Entry Level Three: Two Grades 1-9
- Level 1: Four Grades 1-9
- Level 2: Four Grade 3s or above
- Level 3: Five Grade 4s including English Language or Maths
- Level 1/2, we will consider 1 Vocational Qualification in a related subject
- Level 3, we will consider
 1 Vocational Qualification in place of a GCSE and will also require a grade 4 in Maths or English Language
- Level 3 is a two year study programme and is equivalent to three A-Levels
- Assessment mostly coursework with some exam modules

T-Levels

- Five 5s including English Language & Maths
- We will consider 1
 Vocational Qualification in place of a GCSE, providing English
 Language and Maths has been achieved at grade 5 or above
- Equivalent to three A-Levels
- A mix of classroom learning and industry experience (approx. 45 days in industry)
- Two year study programme
- Assessment mostly coursework with some exam modules
