English Subject Terminology

1	Simile	A way of describing something by comparing it to something else, usually by using the words 'like' or 'as'.
2	Personification	Describing something non-human as having living qualities. "The wind howled"
3	Volta	A turning point in a poem, when the argument or tone changes dramatically.
4	Sensory language	Description that links readers to the 5 senses (touch, sight, smell, taste, sound)
5	Metaphor	A way of describing something by saying that it is something else.
6	Phonetic spelling	The way a person pronounces the words of a language.
7	Caesura	A pause in a line of poetry.
8	Structure	The order and arrangement of ideas in a text.
9	Repetition	Repeating an image or idea in writing to create a stand-out pattern.
10	Audience	The person or group of people that read or listen to a text.
11	Form	The type of text (e.g. a letter, a speech) or poem (e.g. a sonnet or a ballad).
12	Persuade	To make someone believe or agree to do something.
13	Argue	To state that something is true and give reasons.
14	Perspective	A point of view, an attitude towards something
15	Inform	To give information to somebody.
16	Direct address	When the narrator speaks directly to the reader or audience.
17	Emotive language	Words that make you feel a particular emotion.
18	Imperative verbs	A verb that gives orders or directions.

BIG IDEAS

1	Community	A sense of belonging somewhere and feeling part of a group.
2	Inclusion	To make or consider something as part of a group.
3	Prejudice	An unfavourable opinion or dislike formed without examining the facts fairly.
4	Empathy	To be able to understand and share in the feelings of another person.
5	Representation	The description of someone in a particular way.
6	Misrepresentation	A false representation that has been made knowingly and negatively affects the person/group that is misrepresented.
7	Tolerance	Willing to accept other people's behaviour and opinions even if you do not agree with them.
8	Compassion	Sympathetic concern for other people.
9	Perspective	A person's particular opinion or view about something.
10	Voice	The right to express an opinion or desire.
11	Identity	The fact of being who a person is, made up of (background, culture, family)
12	Reflection	To think deeply or carefully about something.
13	Stereotype	A common idea of someone that is often over-simplified and fixed.
14	Pride	Dignity or self-respect. And a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction when you have done something well.
