Greater Manchester Workforce

Workforce Headlines

Greater Manchester's workforce is deep and broad, and shares similarities with many other city regions – it shrank slightly in the latest survey.

- While many city regions have similar workforce profiles, GM has a particularly high concentration of Financial & Professional Services workers (19.6% vs. 16.5% in West Midlands, 16.6% in Liverpool).
- The Public Sector employs just over 1 in 3 workers in GM, across health, education, emergency services, and local government. This is slightly above average when compared with other regions.
- Since the start of the pandemic in March 2020, the number of the working age population claiming unemployment related benefits is up by around 38% (to approx. 96,000 people).
- Around 1 in 5 workers in GM are employed on a part-time basis but this
 varies hugely by sector, locality, and gender.
- Just under half of GM's population are employed or self-employed roughly 1.33m out of approximately 2.87m. This has dropped by around 30,000 since the last survey (September 2023) as the healthcare and hospitality workforces shrunk slightly.

Bolton: Employment

- Of people aged 16 to 64 years living in Bolton, 65.6% were employed in the year ending December 2023. This is a decrease compared with the year ending December 2022 when the local rate was 69.3%.
- Around 6,600 people aged 16 and over in Bolton were unemployed in the year ending December 2023. This is a rate of 5.3%.
- Around 53,500 people or 30.2% of the population aged 16 to 64 years in Bolton were "economically inactive" in the year ending December 2023, up from 46,200 people (26.2%) in the year ending December 2022.
- Economic inactivity in Bolton is higher than across the North West (23.3%) and Great Britain (21.2%).

Bolton: Largest Industries

- Based on the total number of jobs, the largest industry in Bolton is Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles. Other major industries include Manufacturing, Human Health And Social Work Activities, which represents over 10% of roles.
- · Financial & Insurance companies make up 3% of the Bolton economy, and 3% of the roles across England.
- · 2% of the total jobs in Bolton are in Information and Communication. In England as a whole they make up 5% of total jobs.
- The fastest-growing industry in Bolton is Mining And Quarrying, with jobs in the sector increasing 900% between 2021 and 2022 from 10 to 100
- The industry with the biggest decline in Bolton between 2021 and 2022 was Transportation and storage, which saw an 30% decrease in roles, going from 10,000 to 7,000
- In Bolton, the number of roles in the Information and communication sector has risen by 11% over the past year, above
 the 5% annual increase seen in England.

Bolton: Job Groups

- Business data for the year ending September 2023 show the most common job group in Bolton is Administrative Occupations, accounting for 11% of all roles in the area.
- In England as a whole, the largest job group is Business, Media And Public Service Professionals.
- ONS figures suggest that there are 137,000 jobs in Bolton, meaning there are 0.75 jobs per member of the Bolton working-age population.
