A huge thank you to Bolton Wanderers in the Community for hosting such an inspiring event.




## Water-polo Success




## Christmas Card Competition

This campaign truly reflected the spirit of giving and community, and we are incredibly proud of everyone involved.




## Annual Christmas Dinner
